Casa Hostos operates CT's only exclusive language (Spanish) specific substance abuse residential care services for men and women. Casa Hostos offers an array of behavioral health services and is staffed by compassionate bilingual, bicultural addiction treatment/recovery personnel.

Transitional Residential Services

24-hour transitional program for both Spanish and English speaking men (age 18 or over). Casa Recovery and Noble house offers comprehensive support services staffed by bilingual and bicultural personnel.

MAAS Multicultural Ambulatory Addictions Services

MAAS is a multi-level outpatient treatment center designed to offer a variety of treatment services including behavioral health, medication assisted treatment for Opioid Abuse, and integrated primary care services. All interventions are aimed at building long-term recovery.

"I change a lot with MAAS help, this has been my first and only treatment, prior to entering here four years ago, I used to drink daily and it happened for over 25 years. "To me is it a big of a deal that these 4 years I reduced the drinking to once a week and sometimes I sustain for a month or longer. I am still learning to live a sober life and MAAS is playing a crucial role in it. Thank you"

Areyto Supportive Permanent Housing

Areyto provides permanent supportive housing for 20 individuals with mental health challenges and/or chemical dependency who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. One of the goals of Areyto is to provide safe, affordable housing with supports that will help residents to maintain recovery from substance abuse and mental health issues, resulting in meaningful long-term recovery process; which includes continued self- recovery, awareness and community responsibility
